

# All About Youth Protection Training

## Take Youth Protection Training

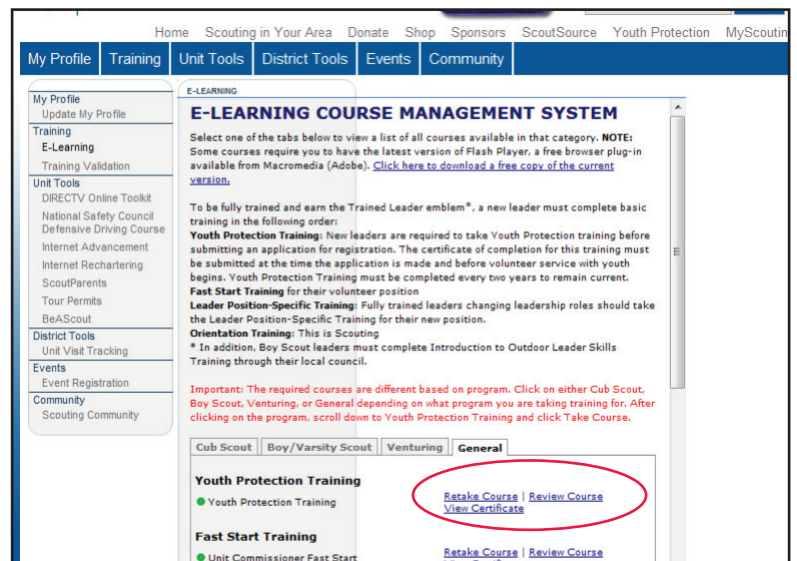
Step 1. Visit [www.myScouting.org](http://www.myScouting.org)

Step 2. **Sign in to MyScouting** or **create an account**, view the *Account Creation Demo* for step by step instruction for creating an account (note: you **do not need your member ID** to create an account, you can add your ID at a later date).



Step 3. Take Youth Protection Training, instruction for taking Youth Protection Training are found in the middle of the MyScouting welcome page.

Step 4. Complete Youth Protection Training, at the end print your completed training certificate (note: you can return to the E-Learning section of MyScouting at any time to print a new certificate



## Verify Youth Protection Training (Member ID Required)

Step 1. Visit [www.myScouting.org](http://www.myScouting.org)

Step 2. **Sign in to MyScouting** or **create an account**, view the *Account Creation Demo* for step by step instruction for creating an account (note: you **do not need your member ID** to create an account, you can add your ID at a later date.)

Step 3. Under *Training* on the left hand menu, select *Training Validation*

Step 4. select *Youth Protection Training* or *All Training*

Step 5. From the drop-down menu, select *Member ID*, enter your Member ID and click *search*

Step 6. View your training record (note: if your Member ID is not included with your Full Profile on MyScouting.org, your record will not be automatically updated)

# **Update**

## **Your Youth Protection Training Record**

**Option A** (“I have taken Youth Protection Training, but the training record is not up to date”)

Step 1. Forward training certificate to the Greenwich Scouting Service Center, 63 Mason Street, Greenwich, CT 06830 or email a copy to Bob.Gunsten@Scouting.org (note: an additional copy of your training certificate can be found by returning to the E-Learning section of MyScouting.org)

Step 2. Follow-up with a phone call or email to verify we’ve received the certificate

Step 3. After approximately 24 hours, sign in to MyScouting.org and verify your training status.

**Option B** (“I have my Member ID, but do not have a MyScouting User Name and have not taken Youth Protection Training within two years”)

Step 1. Visit [www.MyScouting.org](http://www.MyScouting.org)

Step 2. Select *Create an account*, view the *Account Creation Demo* for step by step instruction for creating an account. Make sure you select *I know my Member ID* on the second page of account creation and select *Greenwich - Greenwich, CT -#067* from the drop down menu, enter your Member ID number and continue to complete the account creation process.

Step 3. Take *Youth Protection Training*, your records should be automatically updated.

Step 4. Verify your training (see page one of this document for instructions on that process)

**Option C** (“I have my Member ID and I have a MyScouting User Name but have not taken Youth Protection Training within two years”)

Step 1. Visit [www.MyScouting.org](http://www.MyScouting.org)

Step 2. Click *My Profile* at the top left hand corner of the page

Step 3. Insure your Member ID is included in your profile, under the Membership Info section. If not select *Greenwich - Greenwich, CT -#067* from the drop down menu, enter your Member ID number click Add

Step 4. Click *E-Learning* from the left-hand menu

Step 5. From the General tab, under Youth Protection Training select *Take Course*

Step 6. Take *Youth Protection Training*, your records should be automatically updated.

Step 7. Verify your Training (see page one of this document for instructions on that process)

# **FAQ's**

## **Regarding Youth Protection Training**

### **Where can I get my Member ID?**

Your member ID is located on your BSA membership card. You can also contact the Council Service Center at 203-869-8424 to obtain this information. Additionally, you can contact your unit's Internet Advancement processor who can log on to Internet Advancement and obtain your member ID from the unit roster.

It's important to know you can complete the account creation process in MyScouting without entering your member ID. Enter it at a later date by logging on to MyScouting and clicking MY PROFILE. Click Modify Profile, and then click Modify Membership Information. Enter your member ID, scroll down to the bottom of the form, and click Submit.

### **I don't have a computer, how can I take Youth Protection Training?**

Scouters and Greenwich Residents without computer access are encouraged to contact the Greenwich Library ([www.greenwichlibrary.org](http://www.greenwichlibrary.org) 203-622-7900). Public computers and free wifi are available at the Main Library (101 W. Putnam Ave) and the Cos Cob and Byram branch locations. Please note, sound is required when taking Youth Protection Training, you should bring your own set of headphones or plan on purchasing a set at the library. In addition, there may be a cost associated with printing, contact the library (203-622-7900) for more information.

Scouters are also encouraged to contact the Council Service Center (63 Mason Street) for additional resources at 203-869-8424.

### **Why do I need to take Youth Protection Training?**

Effective June 1, 2010 -Youth Protection training is required for all BSA registered volunteers, regardless of their position.

New leaders are required to take Youth Protection training before submitting an application for registration. The certificate of completion for this training must be submitted at the time the application is made and before volunteer service with youth begins.

Youth Protection training must be taken every two years. If a volunteer's Youth Protection training record is not current at the time of recharter, the volunteer will not be reregistered.

### **Who needs to take Youth Protection Training?**

Youth Protection training is required for all BSA registered volunteers, regardless of their position.

### **Who needs to register as an adult volunteer?**

Two registered adult leaders or one registered leader and a parent of a participant, or other adult, one of whom must be 21 years of age or older, are required on all trips and outings. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities. The **Greenwich Council strongly encourages all adult volunteers in contact with youth to register with the Boy Scouts of America. In addition, all adults associated with Scouting should take Youth Protection Training.**

# WHAT MAKES A TRAINED LEADER?



Adult leaders are considered trained and eligible to wear the official *Trained* emblem recognition once they have completed the basic training requirements outlined below
